BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATION (BCA)

The duration of BCA program is three years consisting six semesters. There shall be examination at the end of each semester. The medium of introduction and examination shall be English.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination (in any stream i.e. Science, Arts, Commerce, Vocational etc.) from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, with 40% marks (35% marks in case of SC/ST candidates)

OR

Any examination of a Board/University/College/School in a Foreign Country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalence committee or on the recommendation of association of Indian University, with 40% marks (35% in case of SC/ST candidates).

Subsidized Seats: As per University rules 75% seats will be filled out of the candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination from the school situated in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable.

AGE LIMIT

Maximum age limit for the admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for the girl candidates as on 1st July of the year 2026. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

BASIS OF ADMISSION

The admission will purely be on the basis of percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in 10+2. If there is a tie then first, the percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in matriculation will be considered, and second the candidates older in age will be given preference.

TRAINING

One month short term training and minor project submission will be mandatory for each student after the examination of 2nd, 4th & 6th Semester

SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATION

The pass percentage in each subject will be 40%

I) Theory Papers:

For Regular students each paper will be of 100 marks (70 marks for End Semester Examination and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment) and duration of each paper will be 3 hours.

- i) Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- ii) End-Semester Examination (ESE) accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

Note:

1. A student will have to pass both the components (i.e.) CCA and ESE separately to become eligible to be declared successful in a course.
2. The ratio of Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and End-Semester Examination (ESE) would remain unchanged (i.e. 30:70) for the students of the academic session.
3. Fund to be deducted in case of fee refund 1. University Development Fund 2. Processing Fee 3. Admission 4. Tuition 5. PTA
Fee will Be refunded only during the admission.

Mid-Term (Minor) Test-There will be one mid-term test, to be conducted when approximately 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This mid-term test will be for 15 marks. Mid term test will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teacher.

Seminar/Assignment/Term Paper-The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment/term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.

End-semester Examination (ESE): The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an end-semester examination (ESE) that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

1. About the Course

The Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA) is a dynamic program designed to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of computer applications. This one-year course bridges the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical expertise, empowering graduates with the necessary skills to excel in the ever-evolving technology sector. From software development to database management, and web designing to programming languages, the PGDCA equips learners with a broad spectrum of competencies, opening doors to a plethora of career opportunities in the IT industry

2. Eligibility

Provided that the candidate is a Graduate with minimum 50% marks (45% in a case of SC./ST.) in aggregate in Bachelor's Degree or equivalent from a University established by law in India shall be eligible to apply for the admission. Or A Bachelor's Degree or equivalent with a minimum of 48 credits in Major subject, 48 credits in two minor subjects, 9 credits in compulsory, 1 credit in GI & hobby with aggregate of 106 credits for the award of pass degree.

Age Limit: As per the university rules the upper age limit is 26 years for boys, 28 year for girls & 29 years for SC/ST Candidates as on 1st July 2026.

3. Basis of Admission

The admission to PGDCA course will be made on the basis of merit of the Qualifying Examination (Bachelor Degree).

4. Scheme of Examination

English shall be the medium of instruction and examination. The pass marks in each course shall be 40% in each written paper and in the internal assessment separately, and 40% in viva-voce, project work and semester course and 50% in the aggregate subject to the conditions that aggregate shall be determined at the end of the examination. Other rules shall be as per the rules of the university

a. Theory Papers:

Each paper will be of 100 marks (75 marks for theory exam and 25 marks for internal assessment) and duration of each paper will be 3 hours. In respect of theory papers 25 marks in each paper shall be reserved for award of internal assessment based on such work as assignments/practical/periodical tests/quiz etc. Note: In each theory paper, nine questions are to be set. Four questions are to be set from each Unit and candidate is required to attempt two questions from each unit. Question number nine will be compulsory, which will be of short answer type with 5-10 parts, out of the entire syllabus. In all, five questions are to be attempted

b. Practical Examination: Each paper will be of 100 marks (75 marks for practical exam and 25 marks shall be reserved for internal assessment) and duration of each paper will be 3 hours. Practical exam will be conducted by the external examiner from the panel submitted by Chairman, Department of Computer Science, and Himachal Pradesh University and duly approved by the university authority/evaluation branch, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.

The duration of BBA course is three years consisting six semesters. There will be examination at the end of each semester.

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, with 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

Or

Any examination of a Board/University/School in a Foreign Country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalent committee or on the recommendation of Association of Indian university, with 50% marks (45% in case of SC/ST candidates).

As per H.P. University rules 75% seats will be filled out of the candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination from schools situated in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable.

AGE LIMIT

Maximum age limit for the admission to BBA course is 22 years for general category and 25 years for SC/ST candidates, as on 1st July of the year 2025. Relaxation of three years is given to SC/ST candidates and the Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months

BASIS OF ADMISSION

Admission shall be made on the basis of merit determined on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 examination. A candidate with commerce or Mathematics at plus two levels will be given additional 10% of the percentage marks obtained in plus two, while computing merit for admission. If there is tie then first, the percentage of marks (rounded up to two decimal places) obtained in matriculation will be considered, and if again a tie the candidate older in age will be given preference.
